We wanted to create an accommodation experience based on a strong connection to nature. The Uni Villa is beautiful, compact and practical.

Task

The Uni Villa concept is based on the idea of providing a functional and beautiful turnkey solution for both new and experienced tourism entrepreneurs. The units are modular and made of wood, specifically cross-laminated timber (CLT). They are prefabricated in a factory and delivered to the site in three parts, optimizing resource efficiency.

Uni Oravi differs from the previous Kytäjä Resort in many ways to suit the location and serve users in the best possible way.

These units offer luxurious and private lodging in the midst of nature, right on the shores of the Oravi canal.

In the previous project at Kytājā Golf Resort, a single 112m2 Uni Villa consisted of two smaller studio apartments and one luxorious suite. In the Oravi villa unit, on the other hand, there is one apartment with two bedrooms, accommodating up to six people. The villas feature a spacious kitchen, living room, bathroom, and sauna facilities, allowing for comfortable togetherness even for larger groups. Thanks to the new layout, there is now more privacy both inside and outside the villa. The U-shape of the buildings creates a private courtyard between the bedrooms of each villa, where one can peacefully enjoy the outdoors.

Similarly, the interiors are meant to support and reflect the authentic food offered, which is crafted from high-quality ingredients that are locally sourced.

Task

The floating saunas of Allas Sea Pool were designed as a solution to a surprising situation when the original saunas were damaged as a result of a cruise ship colliding with the building. To make it possible for swimmers to use the saunas in the summer season, we designed separate floating saunas that could be placed on the water right by the pools when the original saunas were still under renovation. Thanks to this solution, the summer season of Allas Sea Pool was able to get under way.

The new saunas bring a summer cottage vibe to the centre of Helsinki. The three small saunas allow for dipping straight into the pool or stepping onto the cooling deck from the sauna, much like in the countryside. Instead of a forest scene, however, the diagonal roofs create a streamlined silhouette against the backdrop of Kauppatori. And the story can continue elsewhere, since the floating elements are easy to move and place somewhere else later on.

As its name suggests, Saunaravintola Kiulu is both a sauna and restaurant as well as the backdrop for all sorts of impromptu events within the city. Within the restaurant, the dining experiences vary from formal to casual while two saunas offer either a community-driven bathing experience or a more intimate, closer one. All of these spaces are unified through a shared outdoor terrace, bringing the entire experience closer to not only the adjacent lake, but the vast nature around it.

Pistohiekka sauna-restaurant is the first step towards rebuilding the Pistohiekka resort area which flourished until the 1980s but has since disappeared. The project brings long-awaited services back to the area in the form of a lakeside sauna and a restaurant. Pistohiekka sauna-restaurant is one of the key development sites in Studio Puisto's design for developing tourism and wood construction in Pistohiekka. The concept boasts a strong design aesthetic based on a central, curvedoutdoor space with the restaurant and sauna spaces spiraling around it.

The idea of the SantaPark Arctic World was brought to life for the first time when sketching the different ideas of the new concept together with the client. Very soon after the first sketches, the vision was clear: The concept would build around small wooden houses blurring the line between the interior and exterior, enhancing the very mystical experience of the northern landscape. Placed across the site individually adapting to the special requirements and features of the location, the concept would stand delicately on the steep forested hill surrounded by the raw arctic nature, drawing its inspiration from the northern culture and tradition of SantaPark.




Task

Lakkegata Aparthotel is an international joint venture between Skanska Norway and Forenom. Situated in the very centre of Oslo, it is close to the main train station and all the attractions of the city centre. The surrounding Grønland area is an up-and-coming, lively and interesting neighbourhood. The subtle and stylish red-brick office building at Lakkegata 3 was originally constructed in the mid-80s and has now been transformed into a top-of-the-line apartment hotel. The are altogether 163 rooms over 6 floors with an additional ground floor which will include other commercial features that compliment both the needs of hotel customers and the surrounding neighbourhood.
